**Pilot Dies
From Crash
In Indiana**

Kenneth James Clark, 25, of 2813 E. College Ave., was killed Monday in an airplane crash only a few miles from his destination.

The wreckage of the single-engine private plane, a Tri-Pacer which Clark was piloting was bound by (*illegible*) out 10 miles north of Madison, Ind.

The crash occurred in foggy weather in a clearing of a wooded area on the vast reservation, used for ammunition testing.

Clark was ferrying the plane to its owner who had left it in Columbus last week because he was snowbound.

Clark was an employee of Lane Aviation Corp, but was returning this plane on his own time. He had been flying about two years and held instructor, commercial and instrument flying licenses. He was graduated from Westerville High.

At Lane Clark was a "line-man" whose duties include servicing planes.

Surviving are his parents with whom he lived, Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth H. Clark; a sister, Mrs. Dennis L. Dixon of Williams Air Force Base, Chandler, Ariz.; and brothers, William, with the U.S. Coast Guard, and David, at home.

Friends may call at the Moreland Funeral home from 3-4 and 7-9 today. Funeral services will be conducted at 2:00 p.m. Friday in Grace Lutheran Church. Interment will be in Otterbein Cemetery.
