Mrs. Jean F. Clark Dies Following Several Months Illness

Mrs. Jean Frazer Clark, 50, head of the elementary education department at Otterbein College for the past six years died Wednesday at her home, 140 Mossman Ave., following several months illness.

Mrs. Clark had been hospitalized at the College Health Center since Feb 5, but had been removed to her home just two weeks before her death.

A teacher at Otterbein since September, 1942, Mrs. Clark was educated at Genesco State Normal School in New York and at Columbia University, where she received her bachelor's degree in education in 1938. In 1941 she received her master's degree at Ohio State University, where she also did graduate work between 1941 and 1944.

Recently she had been teaching at Ohio University, Athens, during the summer sessions.

She was an active member of the National Association for Childhood Education and served as chairman of the committee on Basis of Teacher Selections.

A native of Ft. Covington, N.Y., Mrs. Clark studied oil painting under Phoebe Alnutt in Philadelphia during 1935 and 1936, and in 1936 engaged in child case analysis under the direction of Otto Rank there.

Surviving Mrs. Clark are her husband, Harry and four sisters and two brothers, all in New York.

Services will be held Saturday at 2 p.m. in the First Evangelical United Brethren Church with Dr. J. Gordon Howard, Rev. N.J. Boyer and Rev. M.J. Miller, officiating. Burial was med in Otterbein Cemetery by the Moreland Funeral Home.
