Death of William Cooper.

William Cooper, one of the leading citizens of this township, died at his residence, two miles south of town, on Monday night at eleven o'clock. Mr. Cooper had been sick for some time, the immediate cause of his death being a complication of diseases and heart trouble. He was a pioneer of Franklin county, having been born on the farm where he has since resided, about sixty-two years ago. He has always been connected with every enterprise that would develop and add to the prosperity of the citizens of Blendon township, and in both public and private life has taken great interest in all measures of public benefit. He has always taken a great interest in politics, voting with the Democrat yearly. Mr. Cooper was never married and leaves two unmarried sisters, who lived with him. The funeral was held at his late residence at two o'clock Wednesday afternoon. Rev. Mr. Nave, of the Presbyterian church, conducted the exercise.
